Intervention Research: Developing Social Programs

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Intervention research is presented as a sequence of activities, in general moving from the qualitative to the quantitative. Front-end inquiry—design and development—uses methods that are comfortable for social workers in agency settings and require modest budgets.

Research in child development has established that the rate of learning and development is most rapid in the first 3 years of life. With diagnosis of a delay, disability, or high-risk factors at birth or soon after and the imposition of intervention, developmental gains are greater, and the likelihood of developing further problems is reduced.
