Huā (花) means at once "flower" (archaic, namely 華) and "magnificence." Yán (严), short for zhuàngyán (庄严), means "to decorate (so that it is solemn,

dignified)." Japanese: Daihōkō Butsu-kegon Kyō (大興王佛所説金剛經), usually known as the Keron Kyō (経). This title is identical to Chinese above, just in Shinjitai characters.
